
Recommended Vaccine Schedule FOR Broodmares

Based on American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) Vaccination Guidelines¹

Experts recommend broadmares receive additional vaccinations for protection from disesases that could impact the pregnancy and potentially harm the developing foal. This includes booster vaccinations in the last 4-6 weeks of your mare's pregnancy to increase the antibodies in her colostrum to help protect her foal in the early weeks





CORE VACCINATIONS:

Protection from diseases that are endemic to a region, those with potential public health significance, required by law, highly infectious, or pose a risk of severe disease and death.

RISK-BASED VACCINATIONS:

Protection from diseases which your horse may be more likely to encounter depending on where you live, your travel plans, and amount of socialization selected for use based on risk assessment performed by, or in consultation with, a licensed veterinarian.
